Just to show you how nonsensical the Hebrew Emoji movement is, here is how you could interpret various Hebrew words in the Old Testament (depending upon whose "mystical" definitions of letters you choose):

ba'al (bet-ayin-lamed) [Baal] בעל : the house of purification is learning

to`avah (tav-vav-ayin-bet-he) [abomination] תועבה : That which is marked on the pegs of the Tabernacle purifies the house of divine revelation

chata't (chet-tet-aleph-tav) [sin] חטאת : Spiritual realization is the creative mercy of ultimate reality and perfection

'asherah (aleph-sheen-raish-he) [Asherah] אשׁרה : Perfection is the tree of life for the spiritual DNA of divine revelation

gamal (gimel-mem-lamed) [camel] גמל : The recompense of balanced emotions is a lightning strike of energy

shulchan (sheen-lamed-chet-nun) [table] שׁלחן : The transformation from learning is a ladder to humility

satan (samech-tet-nun) [Satan/the Satan] שׁטן: The fire of 9 months of pregnancy makes one flexible

You don't have to be a catapult scientist or a Jewish mystic to understand the 10 Commandments or the Sermon on the Mount! God went out of His way to reveal Himself, to make Himself plain, i.e., to clearly give a revelation of Himself and His ways. Looking for hidden mystical meanings in Scripture is not to go back to the Jewish Christianity of the first century, but to fall into the trap of Gnosticism (and proto-Gnosticism) which the early church--including some New Testament authors--fought so hard against.
